A major milestone of the project has been the creation of the Intelligence Analyst Job Profile, which defines the essential competencies, career pathways, and professional skills needed in the field. This profile was validated during the 2nd Transnational Meeting in Valencia and further disseminated through national events in Greece, Spain, and Italy. Grounded in extensive research—including interviews, focus groups, and desk studies—this framework ensures that intelligence professionals are well-prepared for the evolving job market.

Looking ahead, the ANALYST project is launching an innovative training program, including a Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) to enhance intelligence research. Additionally, a 5-day summer school will provide hands-on training in risk analysis, strategic information management, and data collection. Complementing this, a 3-month internship program in each participating country, supervised by Hozint, will help bridge the gap between education and employment, offering analysts real-world experience in intelligence operations.



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
